CRIME REPORT

Our thanks to PC Andrew Buckingham who emails us with his NWN article, from which we extract items which may be valuable in keeping villagers alert to what's going on in the area:

Overnight between Wednesday 26th and Thursday 27th January thieves gained access to some stables on Ermine Street Lambourn Woodlands. They left empty handed as all the 'horse tack' had been removed. Please be aware of this if you keep your 'tack' in isolated locations.

Between 1.30pm and 2pm Friday 28th January a distraction burglary occurred in Southfields Boxford where a male distracted the occupant whilst a second male entered the property, fortunately this person was seen and both men ran off and drove away in a car. A local 10 Feb: Vehicle crime, I'm afraid, features again this week with two vehicles broken into. Both occurring on Sunday 6th, the first between 11.30am and 3.30pm when the offenders smashed the windscreen of a yellow Peugeot 205, while it was parked in Moores Place, Hungerford. The second was between 2pm and 2.30pm when the driver's door of a Citroen was forced whilst parked at Combe Gibbet. Thieves stole a rucksack and clothing.

On Saturday 5th February between 1.30pm and 1.45pm a one-year-old Terrier Cairn cross bitch was stolen from an isolated property in East Garston. We are keen to trace a grey Landrover seen in the vicinity that afternoon. If you have any information or are offered such a dog for sale please contact me at the police station.

Between 8.15am and 5.20pm on Thursday 3rd a burglary occurred in Southfields, Boxford, and a laptop computer and camcorder were stolen.

15 Feb: Last Tuesday night thieves forced the lock to a farm building in Farnborough and stole a quantity of riding tack. Theft of tack is I'm afraid an ever prevalent crime on the Hungerford sector with so many isolated stables and barns used as tack rooms. Please make sure that all tack is securely stored and locked away.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH Fred Carter

We have been advised that a security company is again calling on residents in the Newbury and Thatcham area offering free home safety checks and/or selling alarms. They use high pressure selling tactics and sometimes say that they are from the Government or connected with the Police or Fire Service. We would advise using a reputable Company who do not sell from door to door or cold call by phone. It is best to obtain several quotes and not just accept the first offer and only sign up for a short period. Householders and the use of force against Intruders.

Joint Public Statement from the Crown Prosecution Service and the Association of Chief Police Officers.

It is a rare and frightening prospect to be confronted by an intruder in your own home. The Crown Prosecution Service (CPS) and Chief Constables are responding to public concern over the support offered by the law and confusion about householders defending themselves. They want a criminal justice system that reaches fair decisions, has the confidence of law abiding citizens and encourages them actively to support the police and prosecutors in the fight against crime.

Wherever possible you should call the police. The following summarises the position when you are faced with an intruder in your home, and provides a brief overview of how the police and the CPS will deal with such an event.

Does the Law protect me? What is reasonable force? Anyone can use reasonable force to protect themselves or others. You are not expected to make a fine judgement over the level of force you use in the heat of the moment. So long as you do only what you honestly and instinctively believe is necessary in the heat of the moment, that would be the strongest evidence of you acting lawfully and in self defence. This is still the case if you use something to hand as a weapon.

Do I have to wait to be attacked?

No, not if you are in your own home and in fear for yourself or others.

What if the intruder runs off?

This situation is different as you are no longer acting in self defence and so the same degree of force may not be reasonable.

Also you would be deemed to be acting with very excessive or gratuitous force and would be prosecuted if having knocked somebody unconscious, you then decided to further hurt or punish them:

Or, you knew of an intended intruder and set a trap to hurt them rather than involve the police.
