#### WEST ILSLEY WEBSITE

The village website has been thoroughly revised and now can be a go-to place for much of what goes on in the village. It works on desktops, tablets, and smartphones, so you can bookmark it, make it a favourite, or put it on your homescreen to keep in touch with everything West Ilsley. Still at www.westilsley.org it publishes all the Parish Council information that you might need to know. It can list details about the church, the village hall, the Harrow, the Under-Fives and the Evergreens. It can cover cricket, tennis, netball, table tennis, and the great outdoors, and all those pages can be edited quickly and easily. If any representatives want to learn how to manage their own pages, let me know. Very importantly, it can also house the current WIN, so no more searching for the last email. There is also a WIN archive going back to 1987. Another excellent feature is a Planning Tracker which allows you to see what is going on in the village. It's automatically up-to-date and leads you to the West Berkshire Council planning site if you need more detail. I thoroughly commend the site. Please have a look and see how you get on with it. ### COUNCILLOR UPDATE

WBC's environment strategy has been published and there is now a period of public consultation https://info.westberks.gov.uk/draftenvironmentstrate gy. This strategy follows WBC's announcement of a climate emergency in July 2019. The strategy 'details the different ways we, with the help of the local community, can contribute towards tackling the climate crisis and achieving carbon neutrality by 2030'. The consultation ends on 21 February. There was a debate at full council on 9 January about improving recycling. The council voted to conduct a viability study into increasing the amount of food waste that is recycled. Food waste is by far the largest proportion of black bin content that could instead be recycled. Please note that you can recycle food waste for free by putting it in a garden waste bin. You don't have to pay £50 for a garden waste bin in order to recycle food waste.

Unfortunately, the council voted not to improve plastic recycling until the government's consultation is completed around 2022/23. It is anticipated that the government will introduce new rules for plastic recycling that all councils will be expected to abide by. What these rules will be remains to be seen.

We planted the East Ilsley community orchard on Sunday 19 January. We look forward to watching the 20 apple and pear trees grow over the coming year. They will improve an unsightly piece of waste ground and sequester carbon.

I have received lots of enquiries/complaints from residents since the new year including litter, fly tipping, blocked drains, bin collections and so on. I would encourage residents to report problems to the council in the first instance, by searching for 'West Berkshire Report a Problem' on the internet or visiting www.fixmystreet.com. If it's urgent please email customerservices@westberks.gov.uk or call 01635 551111. You will be given an enquiry reference number and your concern will be logged on the system. If you are not happy with the response you receive please contact me. The reason I am given for a lot of unresolved problems is the council's lack of money and not enough staff.

I am on the council's Western Area Planning Committee, under whose jurisdiction our Ridgeway ward falls. If you have any questions about planning applications please let me know. You can search for planning applications and submit letters of support or objection

#### THE ILSLEYS SCHOOL

Happy New Year from all of us at The Ilsleys! We have already had a busy start to the year and have been working very hard.

Children in Atlantic Class very much enjoyed their recent visit to Reading Museum where they experienced life through the eyes of a Victorian school child. They changed into appropriate clothing and had their own desks to sit at. As well as this, the children had the opportunity to write on slate and learn about farthings, pennies, shillings and pounds. As part of our Victorian topic, the children have also enjoyed learning about the Industrial Revolution, different Victorian inventors and inventions and are now working in teams to create their own new inventions. As the term progresses, children will learn more about life for Victorian children, including in workhouses.

Arctic Class have also been on a very enjoyable school trip this term to Milestones. They are learning about Toys and Games and finding out more about how toys have changed over time.



#### MALTHOUSE WELL

The weather has been kind to us in January and we had only about 50mm (2in) rain to add to an average These two good months have December level. ameliorated the effects of the very wet Autumn on the groundwater level and the rate of rise in the Malthouse well has, thankfully, started to slow. It currently stands about 7.25 metres (24ft approx) below ground level.

As a comparison to February 2014 the graph below shows the groundwater is currently about 5 metres (16ft approx) lower now than back then. Provided the rain in this month and March is in the normal range the ground water rise will continue to slow as the ground warms up and Spring arrives.




