### WIN WALKS walking in the

### neighbourhood

A circular walk starting from Chaddleworth - 4 miles (Map O/S Explorer 158)

The lbex Inn is a grade 3 listed building. During the 17<sup>th</sup> century the building consisted of two cottages, being part of a larger

farm complex. Before becoming an Inn, it was an off-licence and, before that a bakery.

With your back to the Inn, turn left, to reach a road junction. Turn right along Farnborough Road, passing some thatched cottages. At the next junction continue straight ahead uphill, and just past the entrance to Chaddleworth House, turn right along a lane signed 'To the Church.' Go through the gate into the churchyard and follow the path around to the left of the Church (St Andrew's) heading towards a hedge just to the right of a large tree. Bear right here, keeping the hedge on your right, to reach a gate. Go through and turn left along a track. At the far end, go over a stile and bear right across a field to reach its far corner. Here go through a gate and walk ahead down a road. Follow the road as it bends right passing Manor Farm on the left. At the road junction take care when crossing the road and continue up the track opposite, passing a barn on your left. At a farm cross track, go through a gate and, turn right, and head across the field beyond. At the field corner, turn left along the field for about 50 yards looking for a right turn over a stile way marked with yellow arrows. Bear left across two fields to reach a stile in the opposite corner near Woolley Farm. Cross the stile and turn right along a road to reach a cross roads. Turn right and after about 50 yards turn left up a farm track, follow it until you reach a corner of Spray Woods. Follow the track as it bends right, keeping the woods on your right. At the far corner of the wood. at a path junction, turn right still keeping the wood on your right as you continue along the woodland edge. At the far end of the wood you emerge on to a road, at a bend continue straight ahead along the road, following it back to Chaddleworth

Then place your entries on the tables according to the classes marked. There will be Rosettes and Prizes for the children and Cups for the overall winners in the adult categories.

### Men Only Competition to bake the best scones:

A £10 prize is on offer to the bloke making the best scones. You can make any variety, sweet or savoury. Don't let Fred and Russ steal the prize again! Here's a recipe to help you out if you need one:

Ingredients

225g/8oz self-raising flour

2tsp baking powder

50g/2oz butter

25g/1oz caster sugar

1 egg

milk

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 220C/425F/Gas7. Lightly grease two baking trays.
- 2. Measure the flour and baking powder into a bowl, then add the butter and rub in with the fingertips until the mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Stir in the sugar.
- 3. Break the egg into a measuring jug, then make up to 150ml/5fl oz with milk. Stir the egg and milk into the flour you may not need it all and mix to a soft but not sticky dough. Turn out on to a lightly floured work surface, knead lightly and then roll out to a thickness of 2cm.
- 4. Cut into rounds with a 5cm/2in cutter and place them on the prepared baking trays. Brush the tops with a little extra milk, or any egg and milk left in the jug, and bake in the oven for about 10 minutes or until they are a pale golden brown. Lift onto a wire rack to cool.

# DOWNLAND SPORTS CENTRE COMPTON

Summer at last!! Well at the time of writing this we are into the 2<sup>nd</sup> dry, warm day following what seemed like an age of wet, miserable weather. Let's hope it lasts.

Our summer holiday activity programme starts on Monday 24<sup>th</sup> July and runs through the summer until Friday 25<sup>th</sup> August (10.00 am – 2.30 pm / Monday to Friday). As usual it will be packed with fun and games for children aged between 5 and 11 years and of course, fun in the outdoor pool will be a daily activity (weather permitting!) The programme will be distributed to local schools and if your child has attended the sessions before you will automatically be on our mailing list. If you would like a copy and neither of the above apply to you please contact us on the number below. The activities are very popular and places limited so please book early to ensure that neither 'you' nor your child is disappointed!

The pool will also be open for public use from Monday 24<sup>th</sup> July until Friday 1<sup>st</sup> September (2.30 – 5.30 pm / Monday – Friday). If you have not been to the Centre before, the pool is an outdoor, heated pool with a shallow end (approx. 3') which graduates to a deep end (approx 6'). It is manned by a qualified lifeguard during opening hours. Children under 8 must be accompanied by an adult. Non swimmers must have an adult in the pool with them at all times who is responsible for their safety.

If you enjoy playing Tennis, please ask about our Tennis Courts which can be booked for use most evenings from 6-10 pm (Monday - Friday).

### LI NK-UP

Erika works for a charity called Link-up which provides a packaging/mailshot service for businesses in the South East. The work is done by adults with learning disabilities, the trainees, who learn a variety of skills to help them.

The trainees take a 2-3yr course run at our new purpose built sheltered work skills unit on New Greenham Park just outside Newbury. After they have completed the course Link-Up offers them the chance of a work placement in the community working with local businesses and charities.

Alison is a supervisor at Link-Up "Our workshop has an average of 22 trainees per day. We take on various types of jobs for outside companies; packaging, mail shots, assembly work, shrink wrapping that sort of thing. All employees are expected to conduct themselves as expected in a working environment; they dress appropriately, work hard and are encouraged to use their initiative. It all helps them gain valuable work skills".

Occasionally employers can be wary of giving someone with learning disabilities a chance. They may have misconceptions of how trainees will cope with new situations confronting them but these are quickly allayed by Erika the Link-Up job coach. She explained, "All our trainees are matched by me to the job but only after extensive consultations with themselves, their key workers and all the staff here at Link-Up, in fact, we welcome as much input as possible because the more we have, the easier it is to settle the trainee into the placement."

The trainee is initially fully supported by Erika then they are introduced to a volunteer.

The Link-Up staff are a friendly dedicated bunch and make all newcomers very welcome.

Sandra has recently joined the staff in the work skills unit. "I used to work in admin but needed a change...I'm so glad I did....its such a rewarding experience......you get a lot back from it."

A volunteer helping by supporting an individual in a work placement told us. "I look forward to coming to help. The support we get is great, training was interesting and informative, all my questions were answered and even e-mailed to me! I gain so much satisfaction from volunteering here".

Another volunteer is hoping to go on to study psychology. "I chose Link-Up (to volunteer) simply because they offered an opportunity to work with adults with learning disabilities. Link Up are part of West Berkshire Mencap so are well respected; they offered complete reassurance by way of my training and their on-going support."

Volunteers are a very important cog in the Link-Up wheel and are needed on a 1-1 basis to support individuals working in the community. They receive appropriate training and support from

Erika and the rest of the team before being asked to venture out. The trainees work in a surprising variety of jobs such as dog walking, supermarkets, hotels, libraries, garden centres, residential homes, meals on wheels, the list goes on.

This is a rewarding experience enabling everyone to learn new skills, enhance existing ones and improve communications. Accessing work means people with learning disabilities can gain higher self-esteem and promote a sense of achievement. Without our volunteers help Link-up cannot offer that chance of a working experience to all their trainees. It just isn't possible.

"If there is anyone interested in volunteering we would be only too pleased to see them. One day a week 10am to 3pm can really make a difference."
