YOUR PALS IN THE NHS

Listening to the patient's voice is an important part of NHS improvements. If local people have questions about the NHS or its services it can be difficult to get an answer, hard to track down the right person and a complex system to understand. With the introduction of the Patient Advice and Liaison Services (PALS) all this has now changed.

The PALS service is intended to provide friendly support for those with issues to do with Ihe NHS from first contact in the community to hospital care. It does not deal with complaints and for that very reason many users prefer to contact PALS because they are more concerned about changing what is going on than making a fuss. The service aims to work speedily and informally. The PALS service is an important part of making the NHS more accessible to patients - it has worked with great success in Royal Berkshire and Battle Hospitals where it has been in place for some 2 years and the Newbury Primary Care Trust is keen that patients or their carers should feel able to use the service.

The NHS can be a confusing and complex organisation to the outsider - but PALS can help to signpost the routes through. PALS works at the heart of the NHS so it can influence how services are provided to patients and act as a patient voice where services are not meeting patient needs. We are keen to recognise that not everyone wants to make a formal complaint and this provides an accessible and friendly alternative.

Extract from the Minutes of West Ilsley Parish Council

Thursday 25th September, 2003 at 7.00p.m.

Present: N.Carter (Chairman), A.Day, D.Holling, L.Gibson (Clerk), and 4 members of the public. Matters Arising

Flooding. Derek Crouch of West Berks Highways Dept gave a detailed report of the recent works carried out in the village to the drainage system, which should considerably reduce the risk of flooding in the future. All drains had been surveyed with a CCTV camera and any problems corrected. Amongst other works, new soakaways had been dug and old ones cleared. Some £25,000 plus has been spent and Highways are confident that this will have much improved the drainage system. He passed over a plan of the system as it was and another of the system as it is now. These are available for inspection by contacting the clerk. Many thanks go to Norman Carlisle who generously allowed much of the waste from the works to be disposed of on his farmland. (Thereby avoiding a costly disposal bill). Parish Council Vacancies. Again there have been no candidates applying for the position. The vacancies will next be advertised on 16th October and the date of poll will be 11th December. David Holling noted that it had now been more than a year since the previous council resigned, Andy Day suggested that maybe it was time to consider other options such as merging with another local Parish Council i.e. East Ilsley, thereby returning control to local people. It was agreed to discuss this further at the November meeting. Formal Naming of Main Street, all three nameplate signs are now in position and the process is complete.

Correspondence received.

<u>Downlands Area Forum</u> will take place on Tuesday 14th October at 6.30p.m. in Compton Village Hall, program available from the clerk. Consultation draft of <u>W.B.C. Bus Information Strategy</u>, copy with the clerk. <u>Newbury & Community Primary Care Trust</u>, Annual Report available from the clerk. <u>Fly Tipping</u>. The Rural Action Group are compiling an up to date list of the worst affected areas and would like to hear of any local problems. More details from the clerk. <u>Village Post Boxes</u>. A parishioner has suggested that for safety reasons it would be sensible to have both post boxes moved to the opposite side of the road where there is a footpath. Clerk to write to Royal Mail with the suggestion.

Speeding in West IIsley

Over recent weeks W.B.C. Speed Management Co-ordinator has visited the village and speed checks have been sited at Main road and Bury Lane. The average speed of cars travelling through the village was within the speed limit. It was therefore considered that no further action need be taken. West Berks Council are running training sessions on the use of S.I.D.s (Speed Indicator Device), which may be hired by Parish Councils.

West IIsley Village Hall and Recreation Field

David Holling reported that he had consulted The Legal Team at West Berks Council regarding charges should legal representation be required over the ongoing dispute with the Charity Commission. The hourly charge is £60.00. Clerk to seek quotes from local solicitors.

No interest from the village had been expressed therefore no progress.

Audit 2002/2003

Following a successful Internal Audit by Ian Priestley, David Holling proposed that the Chairman sign, 1). The Statement of Accounts year ended 2003 and, 2). The statement of Assurance year ended 2003. Andy Day seconded. David Holling further proposed that the Annual Return and associated documents be submitted to the external auditor Hacker Young. Andy Day seconded, all in favour. Clerk to action.

Administration Charges

Further to advice issued by the Democracy and Local Governance Division of the Office of the Deputy Prime Minister, West Berkshire Council have proposed that an hourly rate of £29.08 per Officer will be charged for Officer attendance at meetings together with preparation as from 1st October 2003, (Copy Attached). David Holling Proposed, Andy Day seconded. All in Favour. The Chairman indicated that these costs would come from reserve funds.

Planning Applications

No. 03/01714 The Harrow. Partial demolition, new opening to enlarge trading area, repair outbuilding. As Local Government officers, all members declared an interest and did not comment.
