DOWNLAND SPORTS CENTRE

I am writing this on the first Friday in September and funnily enough the weather is not much different to most of August – wet and grey!

The 'summer' activities have now come to an end and were again well-attended and great fun (did I mention tiring!). We had several new children take part in the activities and hope we will see them again in the future.

One activity that is very popular during the holiday period is the Junior Gym session. We have several children attending the activities who are approaching 11 or are 11 and I thought this would be a good time to let you know that we run a *Junior Gym session* on a Thursday 3.30pm – 4.30pm (term time) at the Downland Sports Centre for young people aged 11 – 16 years.

The session is supervised at all times. We aim to promote correct use of the equipment and concentrate on cardiovascular fitness – the type of exercise that makes you slightly out of breath and feel warmer. While the resistance equipment is also used, the focus is on fitness rather than 'pumping iron' – this would be actively discouraged as high weight loads could be detrimental as a young person is not physically mature at this age. The numbers are restricted to six at any one time to allow adequate supervision so it is wise to pre-book and pay in advance to guarantee a place and avoid disappointment.

And for our slightly older customers....it's back....Thursday evening Aerobics!! starting

September 11th. The classes are at 7 – 8pm Aerobics and 8 –9pm Fitness Yoga (not a spiritual class). A turn up session, costing £3.35 (Members) / £3.85 (Non Members) and a discounted £5.00 (Members) / £5.50 (Non Members) if you do both classes!
