Many people cope in very difficult situations with little or no support and they are unaware of the help that is available to them through local voluntary organisations or the statutory authorities. Many people do not see themselves as 'carers' at all. Many may be reaching the point of being unable to cope and may become ill themselves through stress caring at home can be very isolating and tiring.

Carers Week gives us a great opportunity to recognise the work of those who care for a family member or friend at home and to raise awareness of their vital role.

The theme of Carers Week this year is 'work, rest and play', with an emphasis on opportunities. Many activities are being planned, including competitions, parties and an open day for information (taking place on Monday June 13th in the Town Hall, Newbury from 10:00am to 4:00pm)

One of the main things being arranged for the week is a special prize draw - for a female carer, male carer and young carer aged 5 to 18 years.
