West Ilsley Parish Council

Monday 10th November, 2003 at 7.00p.m.

Present: N.Carter (Chairman), A.Day, D.Holling, L.Gibson (Clerk), and 3 members of the public.

Matters Arising

<u>Royal Mail Post Boxes.</u> The clerk having written to Jill Owen of The Royal Mail reported that over the coming weeks the Royal Mail would be carrying out a survey of volume of use of the post boxes and would be reporting back as to the action that should be taken. <u>Parish Council Vacancies.</u> The deadline for nominations is Friday the 14th November, and the election date 11th December.

Correspondence received.

<u>Thames Valley Annual Police Report</u>, copy with the clerk, also copies of <u>The Winter Service Plan</u> (West Berks Highways Dept) and <u>West Berkshire Partnership</u> first year annual review. Letters of appreciation for donations received from, The Downland Volunteer Group, The Downland Practice, West Ilsley News and The Downland Sports Centre. <u>Richard Morris of H.W.Dean</u> (agent for the Old Chapel, Main St) had written expressing concern that twice in the past 18 months the Old Chapel had been hit by speeding vehicles and asked if there were any future plans for traffic calming in Main Street. Nick Carter to investigate. Clerk to acknowledge letter. <u>Mrs Amy Banks</u> had written asking for the Parish Council's agreement to plant a tree near the village pond in memory of her late husband, Eric Banks. Nick Carter suggested that he request a land search to ensure that the proposed site was Parish Council land. It was unanimously agreed that if the search proved it to be so, then the clerk should write to Mrs Banks with the go ahead.

West Ilsley Village Hall and Recreation Field

Following quotes for legal advice from three local firms of Solicitors, which ranged from £110 - £185 per hour, Andy Day proposed that the Legal Services Team at W.B.C. quote of £60 per hour should be accepted and that they be employed to assist in the matter should legal representation be required over the ongoing dispute with The Charity Commission. Nick Carter seconded. David Holling declared an interest.

Consideration of Grant Applications

Three applications had been received:

Downland Volunteer Group for ongoing costs associated with providing a volunteer car service. £75.00

The West Ilsley News for production costs. £75.00

Ilsley's Under Fives for Father Christmas Outfit £150.00

As all applications met the criteria, Andy Day proposed that they be allowed for when setting the precept for 2004/5. Nick Carter seconded. Clerk to write to the above organisations informing them of the decision and that the approved grants will be paid in April 2004.

The Future of West Ilsley Parish Council

Following the suggestion at the previous meeting that West IIsley may be grouped with a neighbouring council (see attached paper) David Holling proposed that the clerk write to the parishes of Catmore, Farnborough and East IIsley to gauge their interest. Nick Carter seconded.

Open Forum

From the floor, dismay was expressed that it should be necessary for West IIsley to consider grouping with a neighbouring parish. The Chairman stated that all efforts to encourage parishioners to come forward had failed and that the future of West IIsley as a parish in its own right rested with the parishioners of the village not officers of the District Council. The Chairman agreed to write a report for the West IIsley News explaining the situation.
